

As Readers...

We will be looking at a range of texts over this half term. This includes the story 'Emma Jane's Aeroplane' and some non fiction texts.

In reading practice sessions we will focus on decoding, prosody (expression and intonation) and comprehension.

Year 1 will continue to focus on phase 5 of Little Wandle Phonics and Year 2 will be looking at spelling patterns. We will send home weekly spellings to practise.

Key Vocabulary:

Words consisting of the 44 phonemes. Common exceptions words year 1 & year 2 and Little Wandle Tricky words.

As Writers...

Our writing activities will include non fiction, descriptions, and stories. We will also focus on different sentence types and words types. Additionally, we will work on handwriting and letter formation, ensuring letters are the correct size and properly oriented. To strengthen our sentence structure, we will practice using capital letters, full stops, finger spaces, correct spelling, and making sure our writing makes sense.

All Around the World



As Mathematicians...

Our maths focus will be

- Multiplication - $\times 2$ $\times 5$ $\times 10$
- Odd and even numbers
- Division
- Length and Height
- Mass, capacity and temperature

As Scientists...

Our focus in science is Living things and their habitats. We will look at animals habitats around the world and in our local area. We will also learn about food chains and what living things need to survive.

We will be focussing on composing and improvising. We will also look at musical notation and practising our Easter songs.

In DT...

This half term we will be making a 'Sensational Salad'. We will be looking at what we would like to include in our salad and using our slicing, cutting and chopping skills.

Homework:

- Reading book to be read 3 times per week and read sharing book with an adult. Remember you can read the sharing book to your child.
- Maths - Numbots (Year 1) and TTRS (Year 2) 10 minutes minimum per week.

We will be sending homework in a book each Friday to be returned the following Thursday. It will include what we are learning each week and revision from previous week. We will also send home reading words to practise including Spelling Bee words.

Key Information:

PE day – Thursday – Children can wear PE kit.

Reading Folder with reading book and diary need to be in school every day. On Thursday we will collect reading books ready for the following week.

Ideally, every read you do should be recorded in diaries with a minimum of three each week. There will be certificates for those reading regularly at home.
